Breakout Session 2-C: A Blended Approach to Advancing Career Related Teaching and Learning (ROOM 118)

Description: All students should receive an education that provides them the knowledge, skills, and exposure for lifelong success but for too many students, their socio-economic status has a pervasive impact upon their career development, vocational behavior, and occupational attainment. This session reveals a novel approach for integrating literacy and career-related learning beginning in primary grades to develop vocational identity that moderates the effects of social status on students’ vocational choice.

Breakout Session 2-D: Experiential Learning for Early Workforce Development (ROOM 133)

Description: Junior Achievement believes that workforce development starts as early as elementary and middle school preparing over 25,000 San Diego County students annually for the working world. Through our experiential “mini-city” simulations (McGrath Family JA BizTown and Mission Fed JA Finance Park) students from 5th-8th grade explore career pathways, understand key concepts of business and the entrepreneurial mindset, and build a foundational knowledge of finances. This session will provide both educators and business leaders with tangible next steps to ensure our local students are prepared for our future workforce and competitive applicants in our future talent pipelines.

Breakout Session 2-E: San Diego Labor Market Overview (ROOM 131)

Description: This session discusses the San Diego labor market in 2023. We provide valuable insights into the current state of the local economy, including the demand for specific occupations, the concentration of industries in the area, and the availability of educational programs to support these priority jobs. This information can be useful for students and educators looking to understand where the most promising employment opportunities may lie.
